Each year Jim Dumond leads a group of enthusiastic participants in a re-enactment of the portage that local Native Americans made in order to pass between two important waterways that led from the St. John River into the vast interior woodlands; a portage from Little Machias Lake and its access to the Aroostook River, to Portage Lake on the Fish River. This year's canoe carry is scheduled for August 15th. Members of the Wesget Sipu Fish River Tribe will once again take part in the celebration.

# Floating Classroom - July 18th

The "Floating Classroom" will return to Portage Lake this summer, sponsored by the PLA. On Saturday, July 18th, the pontoon boat Melinda Ann, operated by the Maine Lakes Society, will make several trips onto the lake, carrying 12-15 passengers on each trip. During each trip one of the Maine Lakes Society's professional educators will introduce general information about lake health and quality, and introduce several pieces of scientific equipment. Most importantly, passengers will engage in "hands on" activities, such a using an Aqua-Scope and a Secchi disk to measure water clarity.

PLA's Lake Coordinator, Ray Wakefield, has the schedule for the "Floating Classroom" trips. Those interested in participating should contact Ray at 435-3063 to reserve places on the boat. The PLA is asking for a modest \$5 contribution per participant to provide a slight offset to the significant cost of bringing the Melinda Ann to Portage Lake.

## Water Safety

One task that the PLA undertakes each year is to install safety buoys on the lake to mark shallow water areas, underwater hazards, etc. Ray Wakefield and Jim Kelley recently put the buoys in place for this summer season. For your safety and the safety of others, please heed the warning that these buoys provide. One other important reminder: "Headway" speed is mandatory within two hundred feet from shoreline (lake or river).

## Portage Hills Country Club

Another season is underway at Portage Hills. The course survived the winter very well, and the spring rains have worked their wonders. For those of you who have never played there, Portage Hills is an incredibly scenic course which presents a few challenges, but remains very playable for the amateur golfer. On any given day, the scenery can include deer, foxes, ducks, or wild turkeys. Throughout the season, an occasional moose may wander onto one of the fairways. Keep your camera handy!

Back at the clubhouse, take advantage of the Watering Hole for drinks and bite to eat. The clubhouse's expansive outdoor deck provides stunning views of much of the course and of the outlet end of Portage Lake.

As was the case last year, Portage Hills is offering first year memberships for \$200. Evening golf leagues exist for both men and women. All are welcome!



#### Why We Care...

The image on the right represents the footprint of Portage Lake. Since Eurasion Milfoil thrives in water up to ten feet deep, and since Portage is such a shallow lake, the prospect of an invasive plant infestation here is unthinkable. The maroon sections of this diagram represent the areas of the lake where an infestation of eurasian milfoil would ultimately produce a floating mass of thick vegetation that would prevent swimming, paddling, skiing, sailing and fishing.

Infestations cannot be eliminated or reversed. Attempts to contain them or temporarily (i.e year to year) ameliorate them can be extraordinarily expensive for lake associations and individuals property owners.

For Portage Lake, the only answer is prevention!



#### Courtesy Boat Inspection Program

Each summer, supported by a grant from the Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), PLA participates in the Courtesy Boat Inspection Program, under the auspices of the Maine Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program (VLMP) Our CBI inspectors are trained in the identification of invasive plant species and generously donate their time on weekends at the Campground Boat Launch to help you self-inspect your boats. Many thanks to the inspectors who volunteered a combined of 325 hours of their time in 2014. A total of 573 boats were inspected last year. Happily, no invasive plant were identified.
